

AMENDMENT 11
OF THE AMERICA'S CUP CLASS RULE
FOR THE 35TH AMERICA'S CUP

PREAMBLE

ACC Rule 6.11 specifies the Sailing Weight of an ACC yacht to be between 2332 kg and 2432 kg. This sailing weight included 149 kg of ACEA equipment in the measurement weight. This ACEA equipment was based on estimate when the Rule was drafted.

The ACEA equipment included media equipment and weight of compulsory safety equipment.

The actual weight of the media equipment to be fitted the Challenger Finals and the America's Cup Match will be 10kg heavier than estimated.

As a result the sailing weight for the Challenger Playoff Final and the America's Cup Match shall be between 2342 kg and 2442 kg. Rule 2.2(b) specifies the sailing shall be rounded to the nearest 5kgs and therefore the range for the purpose of issuance of Certificates shall be 2340 kg to 2440 kg.

In accordance with AC Class Rule 4.1(a) the following amendment to the AC Class Rule V1.10 is made:

AMENDMENT as follows

1 AC Class Rule 6.11

Existing Language

"The **Sailing Weight** shall be between 2332 kg and 2432 kg. The **Sailing Weight** includes 149 kg of **ACEA** equipment in the **measurement weight** and 18 kg of **ACEA** equipment in the **wing measurement condition** weight."

Amended Language

"The **Sailing Weight** shall be between 2340 kg and 2440 kg. The **Sailing Weight** includes 159 kg of **ACEA** equipment in the **measurement weight** and 18 kg of **ACEA** equipment in the **wing measurement condition** weight."


